

A meeting of the Consultant Selection Committee (CSC) was held on 1st October 2024, at 4:30 PM in the committee room of the Reform Support Unit, School Education and Literacy Department (RSU-SE&LD), Government of Sindh, under the chairmanship of the Chief Program Manager (CPM), RSU. The purpose of the meeting was to evaluate the financial proposals submitted by the technically qualified firms for the project on Community Engagement & Social Mobilization to Implement the Children's Parliament on the Right to Education (RTE) in 30 districts of Sindh.

The firms whose financial proposals were being evaluated had previously met the technical qualification criteria. These firms were:

- M/s Management & Development Foundation (MDF)
- M/s Thar Education Alliance (TEA)
- M/s Sindh Agricultural and Forestry Workers Coordinating Organization (SAFWCO)

1. Opening of Financial Proposals

The financial proposals of the qualified firms were opened in accordance with the guidelines laid out in the Request for Proposal (RFP), the technical submissions by the firms, and the applicable Sindh Public Procurement (SPP) Rules. The financial details of each firm were presented as follows:

2. Evaluation of Financial Proposals

The CSC undertook a thorough evaluation of the financial proposals submitted by the firms, ensuring compliance with the RFP, the technical proposals, and the relevant rules. Each proposal was carefully examined for any computational or arithmetic errors. The CSC confirmed that no computational or arithmetic errors were found in the financial proposals of the three firms.

3. Comparison with Estimated Costs

Upon reviewing the financial proposals, the CSC compared the total bid prices of each firm against the estimated project cost threshold. The following findings were made:

The CSC proceeded to evaluate the financial proposals in light of these findings, considering the total evaluated bid price inclusive of taxes for the sake of calculation.

4. Evaluation Based on QCBS Method

In accordance with the **Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method**, as specified in the RFP, a weighted score was calculated for each firm based on 70% technical and 30% financial evaluation. The following table summarizes the technical and financial scores of each firm:

5. Final Ranking and Recommendation

Based on the combined technical and financial scores, the firms were ranked as follows:

- 1. Thar Education Alliance (TEA) 1st place with a combined score of 100.00.
- 2. Management & Development Foundation (MDF) 2nd place with a combined score of 83.12.
- 3. Sindh Agricultural and Forestry Workers Coordinating Organization (SAFWCO) 3rd place with a combined score of 72.12.

6. Conclusion and Recommendation

In light of the evaluation results, the CSC recommended awarding the contract to **the highest-ranked firm**, **M/s Thar Education Alliance (TEA)**, as per the QCBS method and RFP guidelines. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to and from the Chair.
