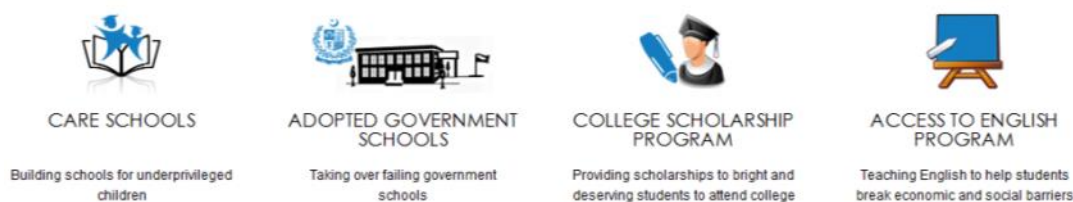

She further informed the participants that the current enrolment in Care adopted school is 170,000 and she also explained schools are providing best quality of education to poor children in different programs (see below detail) and she also discussed the issues and bureaucracy hurdles which care foundation faced



Speaker 04: Mr. Naveed Shaikh, Advisor – Interactive Research and development (IRD) discussed the overall scenario of Pakistan education especially out of school children (OOC) and emphasize to extend the PPP model to accommodate the OOC.

SPM – SD and M.I.S consultant concluded the session and suggest to the forum that forum should sum-up the issues facing by the adopters and to prepare feasible recommendations to change in PPP act as per need of our and prosper future of our children.

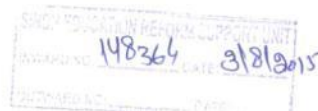

A former Rhodes Scholar (Pakistan-1988), Dr. Bari has a BA (honours) from Oxford, and a doctorate from McGill University.
