


- Government of Sindh renamed the Education Department as Education & Literacy Department in the year 2002.

History of literacy & Non Formal programmes in Sindh

- A federally funded project of Non Formal Education introduced in Sindh in 1995 and the program was run by SEMIS & Planning Education & Literacy department till 2001.
- On 14th September 2002 the Directorate of Literacy & Non Formal Education Sindh was established and assigned a running project of Non Formal Education which was funded by the Federal Government.
- In this Program about 8793 center were assigned to be opened but due to shortage of funds there were just 1509 NFE centers opened. This program was ended on 30th June 2007.
- Under the ESR program 2593 Adult Literacy Centers were opened till 2007 through which 64572 learners and 2593 Tutors were benefited.
- With the Technical assistance of UNESCO Pakistan 217 AlCs were opened in 2009 through which 6530 learners and 217 Tutors benefited
- The Directorate introduced 03 ADP schemes for 03 years as;
- 400 Non Formal Education Centers, enrolled 12550 out of School children and engaged 400 Tutors.
- Reopened 400 Girls Primary Closed Schools, engaged 400 Tutors, enrolled 12225 students.
- 200 Adult Literacy Centers in Sindh, benefited 6000 adult learners and 200 tutors.
- The Funds released just for 5 months in first year i.e 2010-11 and 03 months in 2nd year 2011-12. there was no fund released in last year i.e. 2012-13.

KEY ISSUES;

- i) Needs Non Formal Education Policy & Legislative Frame work to strengthen program Governance.
- ii) Needs Budget predictability alongside mainstreaming Non Formal Basic Education Budgeting Process.
- iii) Needs Human Resource Policy for Non Formal Basic Education Teachers including Official recognition and Teacher education.
- iv) Needs coherent program framework and strategy.
- v) Needs standardized Non-Formal Education & Curriculum and Text Books.
- vi) Needs certification system for learners to be considered setting up of equivalence/accreditation between formal and Non Formal Education.
- Vii) Needs awareness programs for community through electronic and print media.
- Viii) Expanding the scope of Adult Literacy Centers to provide opportunities for out of School youth.

Targets;

- Policy guidelines for Non Formal Education in Sindh.
- •SNE for strengthening the Directorate and District setup.
- •Allotment of SEMIS code for each Non Formal Centers.
- •2000 New NFE centers should have been opened each year.
- •1500 New ALC should have been established each year.
- •Certification system for learners to be considered setting up of equivalence/accreditation between formal and Non Formal Education.
- •Training Material should be developed by the PITE with the consultation of Directorate.
- •Curriculum should be developed by the BOC with the consultation of Directorate.
- •Allocate required funds at least 10% share of regular education budget of the Province for mobilization support and implementation of Non Formal Education program.
