The statistics contained in this document is as at 31st Oct. 2009, which is the compilation data for the Annual School Census.

The data in this statistical bulletin are official statistics for the Ministry of Education. The Statistics in the Statistics Bulletin uses the Population Census Origination (PCO) official population projections.

The information contained in this publication was collected from the Annul School Census (ASC) of 2009-10 that was conducted in Public Sector Schools.

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
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Glimpse on Statistical Figures (ASC 2009-10)

There are 49,605 educational institutions of public sector in Sindh with a total enrollment of 4,489,209 students.

Gender Wise Enrollment and Teachers

The total male enrollment is 2,656,620 (59%) while the total female enrollment is 1,832,589 (41%). Out of total 143,634 teachers 98,394 (68.5%) are male and 45,240 (31.5%) are female teachers.

Categories wise Reporting of Educational Institutions (by level and gender)

Following is an overview of various categories of educational institutions with the focus on enrollment and teaching staff. These variables are discussed by level and gender wise segregation.

1. Primary (Grade Kachi-5):

Total numbers of primary level schools that are reported are 45,044. The total enrollment at primary level is 3,402,391. Gender wise 2016185 (59%) are boys and 1,386,206 (41%) are girls. Total number of teachers at primary level, are 101,944 out of which 72,979 (71.5%) are male and 28,965 (28.5%) are female teachers

2. Middle (Grade 6-8):

There are total 2,668 middle schools reported. The total enrollment at middle stage is 228,832 of which 117,146 (51%) are boys' enrollment, whereas, the girls enrollment is 111,686 (49%). The total teachers at middle level are 9,610 out of which 5,585 (58%) are male, while, 4,025 (42%) are female.

3. Secondary(Grade 9-10):

There are total 1,662 secondary schools. The total enrollment at secondary level is 630,337 of which 376,766 (60%) is boys' enrollment whereas 253,571 (40%) is girls' enrollment. The total no. of teachers at secondary level is 25,550 out of which male teachers are 15,384 (60%) and female teachers are 10,166 (40%).

4. Higher Secondary (Grade 11-12):

There are total 231 higher secondary schools (excluding colleges). The total enrollment at higher secondary level is 227,649 out of which 146,523 (64%) are boys' enrollment and 81,126 (36%) are girls' total enrollment in higher secondary level. The total no. of teachers at higher secondary level is 6,530 out of which 4,446 (68%) are male teachers and 2,084 (32%) are female teachers.

Key Educational Indicators

Following indicators have been taken from prescribed Educational indicators of UNESCO. The data which has been utilized to ascertain these ratios is solely based on Provincial Profile of Sind 2009-10. The higher secondary level's data (Gr. 11 and Gr.12) excludes the data of Government Colleges.


Schools by Education Level

FIGURE 1.1: TOTAL SCHOOLS LEVEL WISE




Schools by locations (rural/urban)

FIGURE 1.2:SCHOOLS BY LOCATION (RURAL/URBAN)



The above table shows the allocation of schools medium wise, as it is demonstrated in the above table and figure that more than 87 percent of schools are Sindhi medium, whereas, only 0.33 percent schools are English medium. While 4.64 percent of schools are teaching in mixed languages namely Sindhi, Urdu and English.

Schools Status Wise


According to data reported in 2009-10 the total functional schools are 44,038 (88.78%) whereas 5,567 (11.22%) are closed schools. Location Wise over 95 percent of closed schools are of rural regions while only 4.20 percent of closed schools belong to urban regions. As in the case of functional schools, 13.6 percent of schools are in urban regions, however, 86.39 percent of functional schools are in rural regions.


If this data is further bifurcated, it is seen that over 90 percent of functional schools are primary level schools, however, only 0.52 percent of total schools are higher secondary level schools. Gender Wise over 39 percent of closed schools are mixed gender schools whereas only 27.03 percent of closed schools are girls' schools. Whereas over 60 percent of functional schools are of mixed gender. The following tables and figures also explain the said information.

FIGURE 1.4: STATUS OF SCHOOLS REGION WISE








FIGURE 1.5: STATUS OF SCHOOL LEVEL WISE.









Classrooms

The total number of classrooms, in all reported schools, are 101,770, among which more than half of its proportion are in mixed gender schools, where as in male schools and female schools there are 27,088 and 22,599 class rooms respectively. However in primary, middle, secondary and higher secondary level there are 77593, 8284, 12803 and 3090 classrooms respectively.



The above tables and figures show the total schools according to the Classrooms in their premises gender and school level wise.

Access

Access refers to the extent to which education is being accessed by the general eligible population at a given education entrance level In Sindh, access to education is predominantly at four levels namely Primary (Grade 1-5), Middle (Grade 6-8), Secondary (Grade 9-10) and Higher Secondary (11-12), excluding Colleges. For the purpose of this document, access to education will mainly be looked at in terms of the initial entrance education which is at Grade 1. The main indicator that is used in determining access to education and this is the Gross Intake Rate (GIR) and Gender Parity Index (GPI).

Gross Intake Ratio (GIR)

The overall GIR stood at 56.77 percent in 2009 according to data reported. This implies that relative to the official Grade 1 entrant age (6), 821935 students are enrolled in Grade 1 among which 54,247 are the total repeaters. By subtracting repeaters from total entrants new enrolled students' figures is achieved i.e. 767,688. GIR is defined as:"Total number of new entrants in the first grade of basic education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the official school-entrance age". This chapter will also cover the broader spectrum of indicators that due with participation in education by the general population. It addresses questions such as how many of the eligible population of Sindh are accessing education. Critical indicator also includes the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER). GER is described as the "total enrolment in a specific level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population corresponding to the same level of education in a given school-year".

Gender Parity Index (GPI)


The GPI measures progress towards gender parity in education participation and/or learning opportunities available for women in relation to those available to men. It also reflects the level of women's empowerment in society. A GPI equal to 1 indicates parity between females and males. In general, a value less than 1 indicates disparity in favor of boys and a value greater than 1 indicates disparity in favor of girls.

In the Year 2009-10, middle level enrolment have the highest ratio where as higher secondary level has least ratio hence boys are more empowered in higher secondary level than in middle level.

Like under the access indicators, the participation rate for primary level has been reported 44%, for middle level 19%, for Secondary level 20% and for higher secondary level it has been reported 3%. Boys' participation in primary level is 50%, in middle level it is 21%, in secondary level it is 22% and in higher secondary level it is 4%. Whereas the girls' participation rate reported in primary level 38%, in middle level 17%, in secondary level 17% and in higher secondary level it is 3%.

The table, above, shows the Participation Rates reported, for the year 2007, 2008 and 2009, gender wise and level wise. The Columns illustrates Stages of Levels, Age group for particular level, and Years (gender wise and accumulatively). The estimated figures are excluding the enrolment of public colleges.

In the year 2007, the total reported rate of participation in primary, middle, secondary and higher secondary level (excluding public colleges' enrolment) was 48%, 18%, 18% and 4 % respectively. The participation of boys' population in primary level was 55%, in middle 20%, in secondary 20% and in higher secondary level it was 4%. However girls' participation in 2007 was 40% in primary, 16% in middle, 16 % in secondary and 3% in higher secondary level.

During the year 2008, the participation rate reported in primary level was 45%, middle level was 18%, secondary level was 19% and in higher secondary level it was 3%. Whereas boys' participation in 2008 was 52% in primary level, 19% in middle level, 22 % in secondary level and 4% in higher secondary level. While the

participation of girls' population, in the same year, in primary level was 38%, in middle level 16%, in secondary level 17% and in higher secondary level it was 3%.

While in the year 2009 the participation rate for primary level has been reported 44%, for middle level 19%, for Secondary level 20% and for higher secondary level it has been reported 3%. Boys' participation in primary level is 50%, in middle level it is 21%, in secondary level it is 22% and in higher secondary level it is 4%. 


FIGURE 3.2: PARTICIPATION RATE OF 2009-10: GENDER WISE

The total number of schools are 49,605 among which 45,044 (90.81% of total) are of primary level, where as Middle level schools are 2,668 (5.37% of total). 1,662 (3.35% of total) are institutes which belong to Middle level. However, Institutes which belong to Higher Secondary level are 231 (0.465% of total) in number. Among total number of institutes 29,013 (58.48% of total) belongs to Co Education. Institutes for Boys are 11,831 (23.85% of total) and Institutes for Girls, in number, are 8,761 (17.66% of total).



The chart above shows the percentage of the "Enrolment per Population- Gender Wise". The overall Enrolments reported in Primary Level in 2009-10 is 2773724, which is 73% of total Enrolment, among which 59.71% are male and 40.29% are females. Efficiency

The efficiency indicators relate to the level of participation. These indicators give a picture on how efficient the education system relates to student progression, completion, dropout and repetition.


Promotion Rate

Promotion Rate is the proportion of students who have successfully completed a given grade and proceeded to the next grade the following year. The progression rate shows s the relative size of the group who successfully moved to the next grade within the education program. To ascertain the promotion rate, of the year 2009-10, the total new enrolment in a particular grade (e.g. Class2) by the number of students from the same cohort enrolled in the preceding grade in the previous school year i.e. 2008-09. Hence the promotion rate is derived by analyzing data on enrolment and repeaters by grade for two consecutive years.

FIGURE 4.1: PROMOTION RATES OF 2009-10



FIGURE 4.2: ENROLMENTS OF YEAR 2007-2008, 2008-09 AND 2009-10 CLASS WISE



FIGURE 4.3: ENROLMENTS OF YEAR 2007-2008, 2008-09 AND 2009-10 LEVEL WISE



FIGURE 4.4: ENROLMENTS OF YEAR 2007-2008, 2008-09 AND 2009-10: GENDER WISE



FIGURE 4.5: ENROLMENT IN 2009-10 CLASS WISE







FIGURE 4.8: ENROLMENT IN 2009-10, CLASS AND MEDIUM WISE




Repetition Rate

Repetition rate measure the phenomenon of students from a cohort repetition a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key measures for analyzing and projecting student flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle. Repetition Rate ideally should approach zero percent; a high repetition rate reveals problems in the internal efficiency of the educational system. The calculation method that is used to ascertain the repetition rate of a particular grade by dividing the number of repeaters in a given grade (e.g.Grade1) in school year i.e. 2009-10 by the number of pupils from the same cohort enrolled in the same grade in the previous school i.e. 2008-09. Ideally Repetition Rate should approach zero percent

FIGURE 5.1: REPETITION RATES OF 2009-10





FIGURE 5.3: REPEATERS LEVEL WISE



FIGURE 5.4: REPEATERS GENDER WISE




Dropout rate

Dropout rate is the proportion of students who leave the system without completing a given grade in a given school year. This rate shows the extent to which students abandon school. High dropout rates imply high input/output ratios and hence lead to low internal efficiency. The Purpose of ascertaining dropout rates is to measure the phenomenon of students from a cohort leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analyzing and projecting student flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle. The Calculation method that is used to find Dropout rate of a grade is done by subtracting the sum of promotion rate and repetition rate from 100 in the given school year.

According to the reported data, in Sindh Education Profile 2009-10, the highest dropout rate has been seen in the grade 10-11 where the where the rate is 80.5 percent%. However the highest dropouts noticed apart from 10-11 is in grade 5-6 which is 35.76 percent.

Quality

Quality in Education can be perceived to be the extent to which education outcomes are relevant to societal expectations such as productivity, improved way of doing things at individual and societal level. Quality in education is mainly measured in terms of improved teacher training, curriculum and the availability of teachers and also the supply of adequate learning and teaching materials.

Some of the indicators which are used to assess the quality of education include student teacher ratio which simply is the average number of students per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year. The student teacher ratio is used as a measure of the level of human resource input in terms of number of teachers in relation to the student enrolment. It is generally assumed that a higher student teacher ratio signifies smaller classes, which allows a teacher to pay attention to individual students, which in turn result into better performance of students. However, it should be noted that learning does not become less effective when student teacher ratios increase. There are many other factors that contribute to the quality of learning experience such as the availability of adequate teaching and learning materials, teacher qualifications, contact time between student and teacher and also the motivation of teachers. Other factors which are considered to affect quality of learning include student class ratios which measures the average number of students per class. High student class ratio is an indication of overcrowding in classrooms which compromises quality. In addition the poor state of classrooms and facilities such as laboratories; workshops and other infrastructure could affect the quality of education delivery.

The Annual School Census 2009-10 reported a total number of 143,634 teachers of which 98,394 are males and 45,240 are females. The female teachers constituted 31.5 percent of the total teaching staff in the Sindh. Of the total number of teachers 101,944 are primary level teachers, 9,610 are middle level teachers, while 25,550 are secondary level teachers and 6530 are higher secondary level teachers. With regard to teacher qualification and certification which is viewed as one of the measures of quality in Education, only 3.84 percent of teachers are untrained and no information for of 2.28 percent is available. The rest of them were in possession of the minimum required qualifications and certifications to teach. Student teacher ratio for Primary (Grade 1-5), Middle (Grade 6-8), Secondary (Grade 9-10) and Higher Secondary (Grade 11-12) is 33.37%, 28.31%, 24.67% and 34.86% respectively.

Student Teacher Ratio

Student Teacher Ratio is used to measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation to the size of the student enrolment. This indicator does not take into account factors which could affect the quality of teaching, such as differences in teachers' qualifications, educational training, experiences and status, teaching methods, teaching materials and variations in classroom conditions. The calculation is done by dividing the total number of students enrolled at the specified level of education by the number of teachers at the same level.

A high student teacher ratio suggests that each teacher has to be responsible for a large number of students. In other words, the higher the student/teacher ratio, the lower the relative access of student to teachers. It is generally assumed that a low student-teacher ratio signifies smaller classes, which enables the teacher to pay more attention to individual students, which may in the long run result in a better performance of the students.


The data, reported in 2009-10, indicates that the highest ratio of students per teacher is in higher secondary level where the ratio is 34.86 students per teacher, however the least ratio has been observed in middle level as the ratio in middle level is 23.81 students per teacher.

FIGURE 7.1: STUDENT TEACHER RATIOS OF 2009-10




STUDENT CLASS RATIO

STUDENT CLASS RATIO IS USED TO MEASURE THE level of capital resources input in terms of the number of classrooms in relation to the size of the student enrolment. The calculation is done by dividing the total number of students enrolled at the specified level of education by the number of classrooms at the same level. A high student class ratio suggests that each class has to accommodate a large number of students. In other words, the higher the student/class ratio, the lower the quality of education due to high span of supervision for teacher. It is generally assumed that a low student-teacher ratio signifies smaller cohorts of students in class, which enables the teacher to pay more attention to individual students, which may in the long run result in a better performance of the students

FIGURE 7.2: STUDENT CLASS RATIOS OF 2009-10 LEVEL WISE







FIGURE 7.5: PROFESSIONALLY TRAINED TEACHERS





FIGURE 7.8: SHELTER LESS SCHOOLS AREA AND LEVEL WISE



FIGURE 7.9: SHELTER LESS SCHOOLS AREA AND GENDER WISE




FIGURE 7.10: SCHOOLS HAVING BASIC FACILITIES LEVEL WISE



FIGURE 7.11: SCHOOLS HAVING BASIC FACILITIES GENDER WISE



FIGURE 7.12: SCHOOLS HAVING ADVANCE FACILITIES LEVEL WISE



FIGURE 7.13: SCHOOLS HAVING ADVANCE FACILITIES GENDER WISE



FIGURE 7.15: CLASSROOM FACILITIES LEVEL WISE




Glossary

B.Ed Bachelor of Education: One year degree course after graduation (two yrs)

Boys schools Schools under administrative authority of District Education Officers (male), generally having boys enrollment.

Branch Schools Schools opened as a Branch of some other high or higher secondary school and administratively report to the parent school. Only

teachers are provided by the education department, and all other facilities are arranged and maintained by the community.

Closed schools Schools that are closed because some reasons that may include: non-availability of teaching staff, enrollment or facilities.

CT Certificate of Teaching: One year training after intermediate education, appointed in Basic Pay Scale 9.

Dangerous building School buildings requiring major repairs/renovation

Dropout ratePupils leaving school before the completion of a given grade of education or leaving at some intermediate or non-terminal point in a

cycle of schooling.

Functional schools Schools that are conducting classes regularly.

Girls schools Schools under administrative authority of District Education Officers (female), generally having girls enrollment.

Govt. ownership Building owned by the Education Department.

Levels of schooling Primary level: including Mosque, Mohalla, and Primary schools

Middle level: including Middle and Elementary schools

Secondary level: also known as High Schools

Other ownership School building is either rental, donated etc., but not provided by the government

Participation rate Percentage of population attending corresponding school grade according to their individual ages.

Ages 5 to 9 in Primary grades (1 to 5)

Ages 10 to 12 in Middle grades (6 to 8) Ages 13 to 14 in Secondary grades (9 & 10)
